## **Background:**

## **Day 1**

### **AYUSHMAAN BHARAT: KEY TO UNIVERSALIZATION OF HEALTHCARE**

#### **Paradigm change in health and wellness**

With the public expenditure on healthcare of 1.28% of the GDP and underperforming public health care systems, nearly 55-60 million Indians are pushed into poverty every year due to high out of pocket expenditure. To address this enormous gap in India’s healthcare, Government of India has launched Ayushman Bharat with its two major initiatives, a). Health and Wellness Centres; and b). National Health Protection Mission (renamed as Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY).

The National Health Policy, 2017 has envisioned Health and Wellness Centers as the foundation of India’s health system. Under Ayushman Bharat, 1.5 lakh centers will bring the health care system closer to the homes of people. Prevention is the key to the ‘paradigm shift’ in health care; the patients realizing that better health is in their own hands. Contribution of private sector through CSR and philanthropic institutions in adopting these centers is also envisaged.

#### **Health insurance: protecting health**

In India, hospitalization means spending money from their own pockets for individuals without health insurance. As the health of an individual is uncertain, health insurance becomes a necessity to protect oneself from the sudden, and unexpected costs. Hence, the Ayushman Bharat –PMJAI envisioned to fulfil the need of health insurance for about 80% of the population. PMJAY is a technology driven and innovative scheme which has potential to make transformative impact if implemented efficiently.

The PMJAY aims at offering close to 10 Cr families health insurance coverage with cashless benefits for secondary and tertiary care treatment within the country. Its implementation will provide relief to the poor population working under the unorganized sectors and protect them from worse health outcome.

### **INDIA’S JOURNEY TOWARDS ATTAINING SDG IN RURAL DEVELOPMENT**

In the past few decades, India has worked a lot towards the fulfilment of priorities such as employment, economic growth, food security, water, energy security, disaster management in rural India. In 2015, world leaders met to draft the new development goals which came out as a new sustainable development agenda, in the form of “Sustainable Development Goals”. Government of India has assigned the responsibility of overseeing the SDG implementation to National Institute for Transforming India (NITI Ayog).

For attaining the SDGs, India has targeted flagship programs and nodal ministries over its immensely large geographical region. The flagship programs range from National Health Mission, National Rural Livelihood Mission, Sarva Shiksha Abhiyaan, Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojna, Right to Education, Ayushman Bharat, Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, etc. Still a long way to go before we finally see the dreams of sustainable development coming true to its full potential, currently we must focus on how far we have come and how we move forward.

### **DRUG AND VACCINE DISCOVERY- IS INDIA READY TO CHANGE IN DISEASE BURDEN**

India has seen an increase in its diseased population over past few years which ranges from lifestyle disease to various newly discovered disease which are fatal too at times. Over the next few decades India has to fight several diseases along with the currently discovered thus establishing control and discovery of drugs and vaccines is needed. ## **GUIDELINES FOR PAPER AND POSTER PRESENTATIONS**

### ***POSTER:***

**Abstract:** Title of poster (Font size 14), Names of the author and co-author –Initial name followed by surname (Font size – 12), Affiliation(s) of authors(s) (Font Size – 12). Maximum 500 words should include the rationale, objectives, methodology, key findings and conclusion.

**Poster Size & Material:** 2 ½ ft. (width) x 4 ft. (length) – Vertical, Vinyl.

- Text, visuals (graphs, photographs, schematics, maps, etc.) can be used. Text and visuals should be readable from 5 feet away.
- Single line spacing with “1” left and right margins.
- Make sure that any visual can "stand alone" (i.e., graph axes are properly labeled, symbols are explained, etc.).
- Poster to be displayed at the venue of the conference.
- Poster presentation of 10 minutes to be made in front of a panel of experts.
- First three winners will be awarded at the Valedictory session of Pradanya,2018
- Maximum two presenters per poster.

### ***PAPER:***

**Abstract:** Title of paper (Font size 14), Names of the author and co-author –Initial name followed by surname, Affiliation(s) of authors(s) (Font Size – 12). Maximum 500 words, should include the rationale, objectives, methodology, key findings and conclusion.

### **About paper:**

- 3000-3500 words for paper (Times New Roman, Font size – 12), Single line spacing with one inch. Justify margins.
- The research paper should be arranged in the following sections: Title, Author(s), Address, Structured Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Materials and methods, Results and Analysis, Discussion, Conclusion(s) and References.
- Table and charts should be adjuncts to the text and must not repeat material already presented.
- Author or co-author will make a 15-minute power point presentation in front of a panel of experts.
- First three winners will be awarded at the Valedictory session of Pradanya, 2018.
- Maximum two presenters per paper.
